- Pick up the Shammickite Magazine available from local outlets. And check on social media.
- Visit <u>Combe Martin Museum></u> on <u>Cross Street</u> near Kiln Car Park. Open daily from February 10, 2025 for local information, maps, books, history and tourism. Forthcoming community events are advertised in the museum window and on their notice boards.
- Combe Martin Museum Events: Coffee mornings, sea safaris, crafts, and presentations on local history topics. Recent talks include the <u>local Silver Mines</u>, and Combe Martin High Street. Our museum reopens after the winter break, on February 10, 2025, from 10:30 AM - 1:30 PM.
- Combe Martin Shammickite Farmers' Markets 2025: These markets are held monthly at Combe Martin Village Hall, High Street. See What's On at the Village Hall.
- Churches: Our local <u>Parish church</u>, Baptist and Methodist churches run services, coffee mornings, shows, lunches and community events, during the year. Advertised locally.
- Hunting the Earl of Rone at Combe Martin: The <u>annual</u> <u>spring bank holiday festival</u> features a parade with the Earl, bands and dancers. The evening finale takes place on the Monday evening, at the Seaside on the main harbour beach.
- Books and Jeans Fair: <u>At Combe Martin Village Hall during</u> <u>holiday periods></u>
- Clubs meet at St Peter's Church Hall. Details and dates for

the Women's Institute and Garden Club meetings are posted on social media. They are advertised in the Shammickite magazine available from most local outlets.

- Monthly farmers' markets, shows, Bingo, weddings, craft fairs, sports, book fairs, parties, and local club meetings are held at Combe Martin Village Hall throughout the year.
- The Legendary Mini Cars Grand Tour: This annual motoring event, with up to 250 Mini cars, last passed through Combe Martin on Monday August 26th, at approximately 4:00 pm (see the itinerary).
- Combe Martin's Annual Carnival: Last held on August 10th, 2024, and usually features a parade, Carnival Queen, costumes, floats, carts and a wheelbarrow race. The Uncle Tom Cobley float is a traditional highlight since 1911, and the current float has been used since 1945.
- Combe Martin Pubs Folk Music and Entertainment: Check with the Pubs, and in the Shammickite magazine available from local outlets.
